RHB Daily Briefing recap

Below is a recap of today's RHB Daily Briefing:

- RHBs are informed that tomorrow's transmission of 9-Ball Pool on DX8 will run until 3:45 pm while the Volleyball transmission on DX11 will commence at 4:50 pm for the 5:00 pm match between Thailand and Myanmar. Initially one of these transmissions was intended to be on the main and one on the back-up telecom circuits but now both will be on the main and the back-up.
- The Closing Ceremony on Tuesday, 16 June is expected to run for one hour and fifteen minutes, with the broadcast beginning at 8:00 pm. Confirmation of these timings and further details will be announced at tomorrow's Daily RHB Briefing.
- A Closing Ceremony (CC) Commentator Briefing will be scheduled to take place in the days preceding the CC.
- RHBs are reminded that their ENG cameramen must wear the allocated ENG bib and they must operate within the designated ENG areas. No access is granted to any accredited broadcaster to areas such as the Medical Room, Anti-Doping Room or Referees Room at competition venues. Please cooperate with access control staff at venues.

Final Competition Venues open on 11 June

The Waterski and Wakeboarding event begins on 11 June at Bedok Reservoir (BRV). Along with Floorball at ITE College Central, the start of the action at BRV will mean that all 31 venues have become active.

The BRV venue is served by the Media Transport shuttle bus, departing each competition day from the Main Press Centre. For timings and schedules please refer to the Media Bus timetable printed in the Media Guide – available to download from the SEA Games Downloads platform.

ENG crews wishing to reach the venue from the IBC must take a train from Mountbatten in the direction of Harbourfront. At the Paya Lebar station (two stops from Mountbatten) change for the East-West Line heading towards Pasir Ris, Bedok MRT station is the third stop from Paya Lebar.

At Bedok station RHBs should take a bus to the reservoir. Lines numbered 5, 18, 21, 22, 28, 59, 65, 66, 67, 69, 168 or 288 all pass the competition venue.

Athletics Competition Schedule

There have been several updates to the Competition Schedule for Athletics. Consequently, RHBs are advised to check the 28th SEA Games website at the start and the end of each day to keep informed of the latest programme of track and field events at the National Stadium.

As a general note, it is usually the morning heats which have been rescheduled with the afternoon sessions remaining broadly the same.

An updated document containing preferred field events and transmission times has been posted to the 28th SEA Games Downloads platform and is also available for collection from the CIC.

Delivery of empties for Bump-Out phase

RHBs are informed that they may bring empties, flight cases, containers, etc. into the IBC from 16 June onwards.

As a reminder, items bigger than 1 m x 1 m will still need to pass through the Central Screening Area (CSA) before entering the IBC.

RHBs will not be permitted to bring them in earlier and keep them in the corridors outside of their premises.

As a fire safety measure corridors must be kept clear and accessible at all times aside from during removal for Bump-Out.

RHBs are reminded that the Lockdown period at the IBC ceases at 9:00 am on 17 June.

Operating the venues



HB Venue Operations

Gary Shaw keeps an eye on the nine competition venues featuring live coverage

The responsibility for ensuring everything is correctly in place across the nine venues hosting live coverage lies with Gary Shaw, Venue Operations Manager. "My main goal is to bring all the departments together – Construction, Logistics, Booking, Information and Production – to make sure that all the infrastructure is in place to allow production to make a perfect transmission," Gary explained.

During the preparation period Gary worked closely with SINGSOC in order to understand the needs of the LOC as well as the requirements of the Host Broadcaster MediaCorp. "We have done everything possible to meet the expectations of both parties – before and during the event," Gary commented.

With each venue running to different specifications with regard to their coverage and operations it has posed an interesting challenge. "The SEA Games offer a wide range of sports to cover. That's an interesting challenge for me and all the crew. We pay the same attention to all venues despite the popularity of the sport or the level of competition. For regional sports like Sepaktakraw and Wushu we already have experience in covering the sport at the Asian Games," Gary said.

So far, Gary is delighted with the reports from the venues and hopes that the RHBs share his optimism.

Digital Games

Content Producer Peter Schofield and his team have created a little piece of history at the 28th SEA Games, with the first ever live streaming app for the event.

The SEA Games TV app allows users to access highlights of the competition events and view the match or race from several different camera angles. Effectively, the app allows viewers to become directors of their own coverage

Based at the IBC, the crew receive the Host Broadcaster (HB) feeds from the venues and clip the highlights for multi-camera transmission. Then the content is uploaded to the SEA Games TV app as well as to the event's official YouTube channel. The process allows the event organisers to take the HB produced-content and offer it to viewers in several new ways more befitting to the digital age.


"We did the same app for the previous FIFA World Cup, but where this app is particularly rewarding for users is that it allows them to see more footage in sports where several athletes compete at the same time – such as Athletics or Swimming," Peter explained.

Multi-camera highlights are provided for the Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Diving, Football, Hockey, Netball, Swimming and Table Tennis events. In total, the SEA Games TV app has already been downloaded over 100,000 times.
